

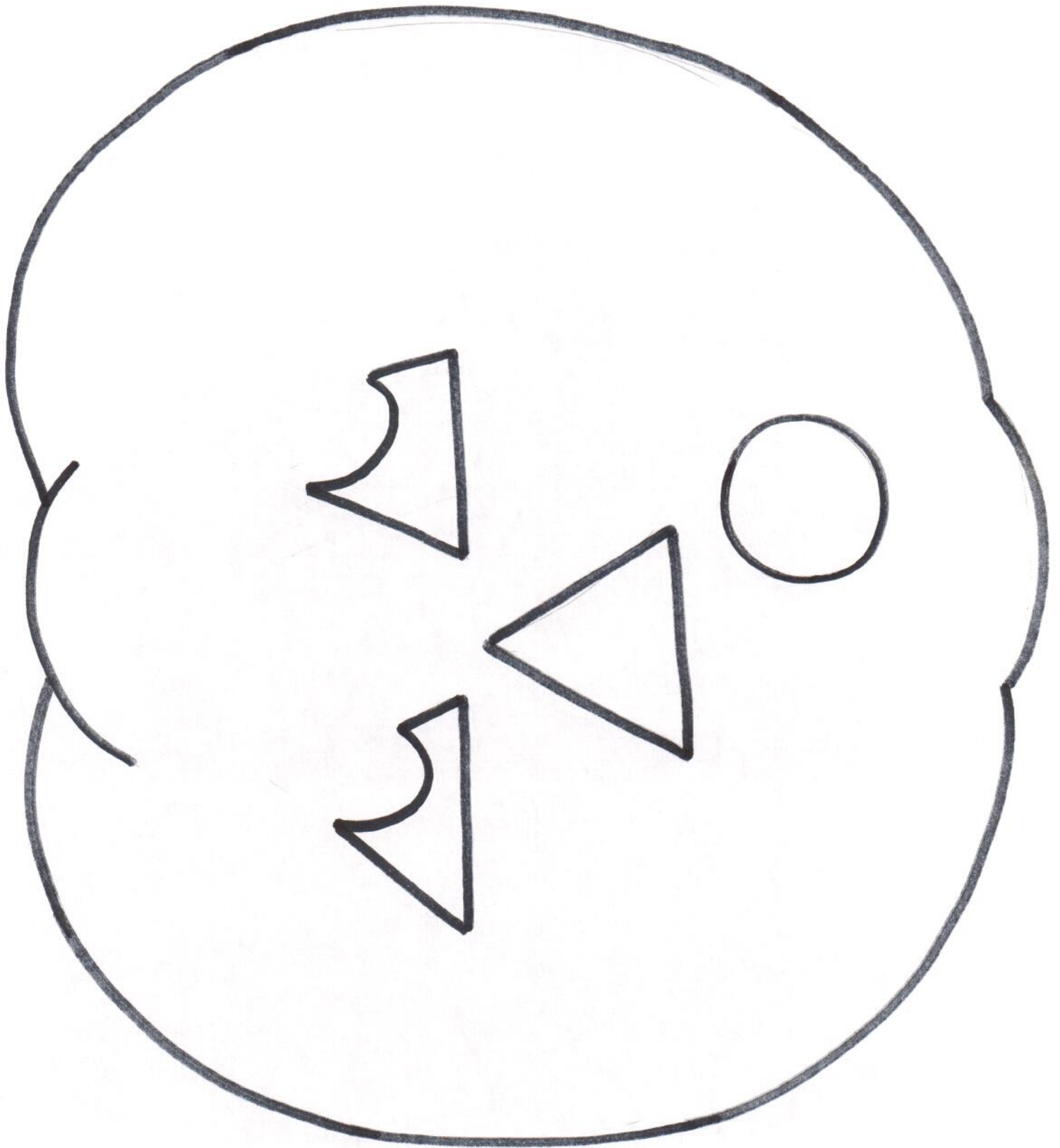
DOOR DÉCOR; OCTOBER

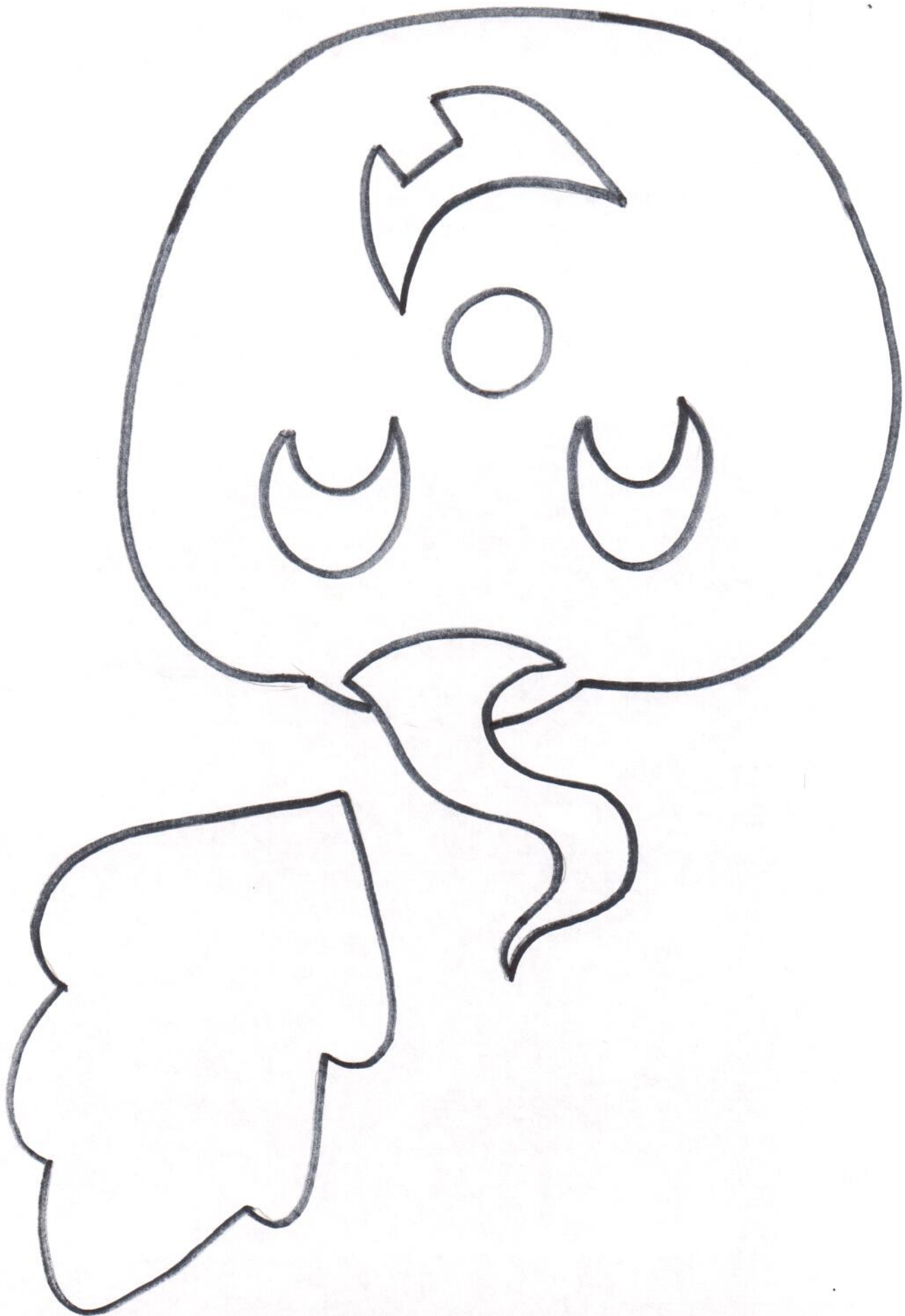
October is another fun month for a one-on-one activity where residents of most skill and cognitive levels can participate. As always, whatever the participant can do, they should be encouraged to do. Those things they are incapable of doing can be done by the facilitator.

You will need construction paper of orange, white, black, green, and brown. Two colors of green and orange would be wonderful. You also need scissors, glue, patterns and masking tape.

Once all the pieces are cut out, the construction of the jack-o-lanterns begins. Participants can have fun with this so be sure to give them, and show them, the several choices. Faces can be happy, sad, or angry. Eyes can be straight or crooked, pumpkins can have leaves or no leaves and they can be orange or white. The little bat is added as an eye catcher and perhaps your participant would like more bats. Lay the completed jack-o-lanterns out on the table and let the resident decide on their arrangement. Glue them together and while they are drying, tape the "H A P P Y" letters to the door. Add the pumpkins and the "H A L L O W E E N" and the project is finished.
