

PICTIONARY

Although participants for this game could be divided into teams, this poses some problems when players are of varying cognitive abilities. it is often more desirable to simply have them play as individuals and allow turns, especially if one or two appear to dominate the responses.


It is easiest to utilize a large dry erase board for this activity but if one is not available, an easel with large tablets such as used during a group meeting will work just as well. Examples of pictures are presented below. There are no rules. Participants merely try to discern the figure being drawn in the shortest time possible. With this in mind, the steps to draw the figure are provided with each step providing more clues to the final product.


The facilitator should draw only one given step at a time, allow several seconds for a response, then draw the second step, wait, draw, wait..... once the final object begins to take shape, allow a bit more time for the responses. It may take 3-4 pictures before the participants are warmed to the activity so be prepared to draw 12-15 or more, depending on your group.













CHEESEBURGER
