Hee Haw is a production, not a party, but a skit put on by the activity staff for residents to sit and enjoy. Plans were made early so props and costumes could be gathered or produced. Spoken materials were

researched and gathered and assigned each player. The players themselves were responsible for their own costumes keeping in mind the theme of Hee Haw and the melodramatic down-on-the-farm presentation.

The donkey used as a prop was built from a refrigerator box. He really did add to the atmosphere and the audience truly enjoyed his presence. The field of corn was also made from refrigerator boxes and this has proved to be a great piece of décor for other activities as well. We have used the corn field for Harvest Fest, Halloween, and Hee Haw, and it has proved to be a good photo background as well.

We were able to have guest musicians for the

performance and they made the program an even bigger success! Every community has a population of musicians. Search around and involve those who are willing to play a couple tunes of country music; guitar, fiddle, banjo, all great choices.

One line jokes are scattered throughout the program, shared by one, two, or three of the players. Short story jokes are presented by individual players such as the one portraying Minnie Pearl or the made-up character Lulu. Verses from the song "Gloom and Despair" and sung one at a time throughout the presentation. There may be several one-liners, then a verse from the song. Then there might be a longer story joke, and then another verse from the song, et.. Fit the guest music in at two or three slots, whatever they are willing to do. Perhaps they could do one sing-along that everyone knows.

This is a greatly enjoyed presentation for the slower season like January or March or for the dog days in August when there are no holidays. It does require a time commitment but it is well worth the effort.
